Kindergarten Registration-

Online registration for Kindergarten began on Monday,

January 8th. This year we will again be offering the choice of morning or afternoon French Immersion Kindergarten, a full day every other day English Kindergarten and a morning or afternoon Kindergarten in our English Program. All students who turn 5 before December 31, 2018 are eligible. Children who were born in 2013 are eligible to register. Once you complete the online registration, you will be required to submit a copy of your child's birth certificate to the office to complete the registration process.

**Skating Starts Next Week!
CSA Hockey Helmets are
mandatory.**



Skating is part of the Alberta Physical Education curriculum in the Alternative Environments

section of the program. It is the intention that ALL children at Ecole Barrie Wilson will be involved in skating as part of Physical Education.

Physical Education Safety Guidelines requires that all students MUST wear a CSA approved hockey helmet for all ice skating activities. Bicycle helmets are not permitted as they are not deemed to be safe. In addition, children MUST wear mittens or gloves and snow pants while skating.

Red Deer has an abundance of skating facilities such as outdoor rinks, Bower Ponds and indoor arenas. *Be sure that the helmet has a sticker that says CSA approved.*

Classroom skating is beginning the second week after the Christmas break, and runs until the end of February. Please check your child's agenda and/or their teacher's web page for skating times.

Please be advised that if your child rides the bus, they are required to have their skates in a canvas type bag for safety reasons.

Also, if you have any skates or helmets that you would like to donate to our school, please drop them off at the school's main office.
